

# MILLBURY COUNCIL

April 12, 2021

The Council of the Village of Millbury met in regular session on the above date via Zoom video conference with Michael Timmons, Mayor, presiding.

Council Members present: Clapsaddle, Cowell, Densic, Harpel, Schwamberger and Traver. Keith Nusbaum, Street Commissioner was also in attendance.

**Motion** by Cowell to approve the March 8, 2021 meeting minutes. Seconded by Clapsaddle. Roll Call: all yea! Motion carried.

**Police report: sent by Lake Township Police**

No report was given.

**Fire Department:** per Dennis Traver

There were eleven rescues, 1 false alarm and 1 smoke detector incident in the village. The tornado siren worked.

**Street Commissioner:** per Keith Nusbaum, Street Commissioner

It is very difficult to get a hold of someone when street lights are out. Mr. Nusbaum and Clerk Densic both have tried without results. They will both keep trying.

Toledo Edison did help with fixing the flag poles at the park.

Ron Adcock resigned. Mr. Nusbaum would like to hire Joel Densic to replace him. **Motion** by Traver to approve the hiring of Joel Densic for the street department. Seconded by Cowell. Roll Call: 5 yeas! Councilman Densic abstained from voting. Motion carried.

Councilman Schwamberger will take the flower pots to Hecklinger's so they can plant flowers in them to place at the two memorials at the park. The Village will then pick them up when they are finished.

**Zoning Commissioner:** by Jeff Mraovich

There was one fence permit and 1 shed permit in the village. He also working on recommendations for a new permit policy.

**Motion** by Densic to pay the bills, issue the warrants, review and approve the financial reports. Second by Schwamberger. Roll Call: All yea! Motion carried.

**Old Business:**

Bob Desmond attended the meeting and discussed the Railroad St, Storm Sewer project. The apartment complex sold so we need to get an easement from the new owner. Once we have this then the project can proceed.

The Ohio Public Works Commission will be offering grants and loans again for this year. They want new projects such as new roads, new trails or new sewers. The grant application has to be ready by August.

Bob also discussed the monies coming from the federal government from the latest stimulus package that was passed by congress. Everything is still up in the air right now as to how much municipalities will get as well as how the money can be spent. Can we put a bathroom in at Passive is a question that was asked?
