The Council of the Village of Millbury met in regular session on the above date at the Millbury Council Chambers with Michael Timmons, Mayor, presiding.

Mr. Desmond, Poggemeyer Design Group, discussed the Railroad St. Storm Sewer Project. He will contact Palmer to start the project. They will contact residents when they are able to start. The project has to be completed by October 1, 2021.

OWPC applications are due in September. Full new construction is what they are looking for.

New Business:

Mr. Desmond talked about the American Relief Plan (Covid Relief). Millbury is slated to receive around \$130,000.00. This money can only be used for water, sewer and broadband projects.

Possible projects: water line to Passive Park, replacing the water line under the drive at the Town Hall. We may also be able to use this money to pay for part of our current Railroad St. project

Clerk Densic will start all the paperwork on this.

Motion by Harpel to submit the Estimate of Revenues to the Wood County Auditor. Second by Traver. Roll Call: all yeah! Motion carried.
