March 8, 2021

The Council of the Village of Millbury met in regular session on the above date via Zoom video conference with Michael Timmons, Mayor, presiding.

Council Members present: Clapsaddle, Cowell, Densic, Harpel and Traver. Jeff Mraovich, zoning was also in attendance.

**Motion** by Traver to approve the February 8, 2021 meeting minutes. Seconded by Densic. Roll Call: all yea! Motion carried.

**Committee Reports:**

Baseball and softball can play at Veteran's Park this year but will have to follow all of the CDC guidelines for Covid. The Recreation Committee will get together to discuss this.

**Old Business:**

The Mayor is assuming that the Railroad St. sewer project is still a go as he has heard nothing from Bob Desmond.

**New Business:**

The Mayor shared that he received information from ODOT about safety grants that we can receive for State Route 795 improvements because we have many segment crashes. Segment crashes are accidents that happen between roads like Fostoria and Pemberville. There are six proposals and council likes proposal number six which makes each lane 11-foot wide, decreases the shoulder by 1 foot on each side and installs rumble strips on each side of the road. This has been shown to decrease crashes by 16%. There have been 37 crashes over the past three years on that stretch of 795. The monies for these grants come from the State of Ohio.

Mayor Timmons will also ask about the possibility of putting up a guardrail on the south side of the road.
